Cheater

(3 Guys)

CHARACTERS:

John: Friend of Kevin's who is concerned about cheating. Tries to convince Kevin that cheating is not the answer to his problems. Toward the end, he gets sucked into Kevin's way of thinking.

Kevin: Has a lot of pressure to excel. Thinks cheating is his only option to guarantee good grades, scholarship, etc.

Adam: Offers to help John study. Later tries to talk sense into John when he starts agreeing with Kevin about cheating.

SETTING:

In a classroom right before class starts. Chairs should be three across with Kevin on far left and Adam on far right. For first part, Adam is into his homework and doesn't really pay attention to what is going on between Kevin and John.

(KEVIN is writing answers on his hand and up his arm when JOHN enters Stage Right and sits down beside KEVIN.)

JOHN: (In a loud stage whisper, like he's afraid they'll get caught.)

Kevin! Mr. Reynolds will be here any minute. What are you doing?

KEVIN: I'm putting a little insurance into getting an A, that's what I'm doing.

JOHN: Are you crazy? That's cheating.

KEVIN: Sure can't get anything past you, can I? No wonderyou've got a big four-point-oh GPA.

JOHN: Very funny. But Mr. Reynolds has eyes like a hawk. You know that! If he catches you, it's an automatic zero.

KEVIN: Exactly. If I get caught. That's why I won't get caught.

JOHN: Yeah, 'cause it won't be obvious at all when you're reading up and down your arm.

16 KEVIN: That's why I sat in the back. And look, (Pulls sleeve down to cover arm) I'll only sneak a peek when I need to.

JOHN: Why risk it?

19 KEVIN: Why? I'll tell you why. I've got three killer tests this
week, I'm scheduled to work almost every night, and I'm
borderline B in this class as it is.

JOHN: So? One B won't kill you.

11 KEVIN: Says the perfect student.

JOHN: Well, I might not have ever gotten one, but I'm pretty sure they're harmless. You can always bring it up next semester.

KEVIN: I can't. That'll be too late. College applications are due now. It won't matter what I make after this.

JOHN: One B is not going to keep you out of college. Well, maybe Harvard.

KEVIN: My dad says straight A's are the only way I'm ever going to get a scholarship. Anywhere. Even a state school. Otherwise, I can kiss the chance of college good-bye.

JOHN: Maybe he's just saying that now ... to get you to work hard.

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- 1 KEVIN: No. He means it. Apparently he spent what little he had saved for my college on his motorcycle last year.
- 3 JOHN: The Harley?
- 4 KEVIN: That's the one. I guess his mid-life crisis was more important than my future.
- 6 JOHN: Wow. That's rough. And a lot of pressure. (Pause) But is cheating the way you really want to do it?
- 8 KEVIN: It's not that big a deal. Half the kids in these advanced 9 classes cheat — it's the only way to survive. I barely get 10 any sleep as it is.
- JOHN: What if you get caught? What will your dad say then?

 Don't you think he really cares more about your character
- 13 than a stupid A?
- 14 KEVIN: Yeah. You'd think so, wouldn't you? But all my dad cares
- about is the end result. Heck, he'd buy me an A if he
- could. (Pauses and then laughs sarcastically.) Well, maybe if
- he hadn't blown all the money on the motorcycle that he
- barely even rides. Honestly, I think he's scared of it.

 19 JOHN: Maybe he'll sell it and give you the money for college.
- 20 KEVIN: Are you kidding? Apparently washing and waxing the
- 21 stupid thing is almost as cool as riding it.
- 22 JOHN: Come to think of it. I have seen him washing it a lot. But
- 23 I've never seen him ride it. You really think he's afraid of it?
- That is so funny.
- 25 KEVIN: Yeah, it's a real laugh a minute. I'll be laughing all the way not to college.
- 27 JOHN: Sorry. I didn't mean it that way.
- 28 KEVIN: I know. It's not your fault my dad doesn't care about my
- 29 future.
- 30 JOHN: Maybe he just wants you to earn it. I don't know what
- my parents would do if I didn't have a scholarship in the
- 32 bag. I think they'd pay ... but who knows? Maybe they
- 33 wouldn't.
- 34 KEVIN: Yeah, right. The same parents that bought you a brand
- new pickup for your sixteenth birthday would definitely not

- pay your way to college.
- JOHN: Well, you never know. (Pause.) And it wasn't brand new.

 It was a demo, remember? It had like five thousand miles on it or something.
 - KEVIN: Oh, poor thing. I forgot they got you that used piece of crap. I think my car has ... hmmmm ... over a hundred-fifty thousand miles on it. And it's missing two hubcaps, a muffler, and the air conditioner hasn't worked since the fifties. And don't forget the paint job! I've got more colors on my car than your girlfriend has highlights in her hair!
- JOHN: No need to get nasty, Kevin. I'm just trying to help.
- KEVIN: Sorry. Guess I'm a little touchy. A life with no future can do that to a person.
- 14 JOHN: You don't have to be so dramatic. I'm sure there are other ways to get into college. You got any disabilities you're hiding?
- 17 KEVIN: Does a freakishly long middle toe count?
- III JOHN: (Laughing) Probably not. What else have you got?
- 19 KEVIN: Think that's it.

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- 10 JOHN: What about multi-cultural? Where are you from?
- II KEVIN: Uh, Indiana. Don't think I'll get anything for that.
- JOHN: No, stupid. Your family. Your heritage. Where are they from?
- KEVIN: Uh ... Indiana. John, I am not multi-cultural. Look at me. I'm as white as rice. I don't think you look at me and think, hmmmm ... that guy's ethnic.
- JOHN: There's got to be something else. (Thinking) You're poor, aren't you? Maybe you can get a grant or something.
- KEVIN: I'm poor. My parents aren't. Schools look at that. They think just because your parents have money that they're going to give it to you. They don't think they're going to spend it on Harleys and Hawaiian vacations.
- 13 JOHN: Hawaii? When?
- 14 KEVIN: Right after graduation.
- 15 JOHN: They're taking you to Hawaii for graduation and you

- didn't even tell me?
- 2 KEVIN: No. You're not listening, John. They are going to Hawall
- 3 Not me. Them. I think it's their "woo hoo we got the last
- 4 one out of the house" vacation.
- 5 JOHN: Oh, that's terrible. My parents would never go on vacation without me.
- 7 KEVIN: Your parents don't go to the grocery without you, John
- They're going to freak when you're at college.
- 9 JOHN: I know. My mom is already crying.
- 10 KEVIN: My mom is crying because there's still six months left
- I think she has a secret calendar where she's counting
- 12 down the days until I leave.
- 13 JOHN: She does not! Your mom is going to be just as torn up
- 14 as mine. She just doesn't show it.
- 15 KEVIN: Yeah. That's what it is. Keep telling yourself that.
- 16 JOHN: Well, at least your parents don't suffocate you the way
- 17 mine do. It can be annoying, you know?
- 18 KEVIN: No. I don't know. But whatever. We all have our own
- 19 little dramas, don't we? Now stop whining about your
- 20 obviously "pitiful" (Air quotes) life so I can finish the
- "dreaded cheating." (Air quotes)
- 22 ADAM: (Finally stops studying and talks to them.) Hey guys.
- 23 heard you talking —
- 24 KEVIN: Great. What're you going to do, turn me in?
- 25 ADAM: No. Of course not. I just wanted to tell you that I'm
- really good at chemistry. I'd be happy to help you study.
- 27 JOHN: See, Kevin. There is another way.
- 28 KEVIN: Maybe if you can cram a whole night of studying into
- 29 five minutes (Glances at watch) because that's about how
- 30 long we've got until Mr. Reynolds comes in.
- 31 ADAM: I'll do what I can ... (Starts pulling out notes.)
- 32 KEVIN: Who are you kidding? We all know five minutes of
- 33 cramming isn't going to help me.
- 34 ADAM: Well, we won't know until we try.
- 35 KEVIN: Thanks, but I think I'll stick with what I've got.

- JOHN: You really think those scribbled notes on your hand and up your arm are going to help? (Inspecting arm) You can barely even read them.
- KEVIN: It's a code. And they sure can't hurt. I think I know the gist of things. I just need a little help. It's crazy that Mr. Reynolds expects us to memorize all this anyway.
- JOHN: It is a lot.
- KEVIN: And when am I really going to need this? I mean, this is
 a complete waste of brain cells. I think he just likes to
 torture us.
- I JOHN: He does seem a lot happier on quiz days, doesn't he?
- KEVIN: Of course he does! He loves seeing us suffer. Squirming in our seats like pigs going to slaughter.
- JOHN: For real! And have you noticed that whenever he writes this stuff on the board he always has a book or notes in his hands? He sure doesn't have this stuff memorized!
- 17 KEVIN: That's what I'm saying! Why should we? He's the teacher. If anyone should know this baloney, it's him. What a hypocrite, expecting us to know this by heart!
 - JOHN: Yeah! Pure hypocrisy!
- KEVIN: That's why we should band together. Revolt against the injustice. Come on, John! Cheat! Cheat! Cheat! (JOHN, caught in the moment, begins writing on his arm.)
- ADAM: (ADAM grabs JOHN's arm to stop him.) What are you doing?
- JOHN: You heard Kevin! We have to band together! Fight the hypocrisy!
- ADAM: This is ridiculous and you know it. Please tell me you're not really buying into this load of bull.
- 10 JOHN: Well ... it does make sense.
- KEVIN: That's right, John. Stay strong! Down with hypocrisy!
 Up with cheating! Free the students! Free the students!
- JOHN: (Starts chanting as if in a trance.) Free the students! Free the students!
- **15 ADAM:** (ADAM grabs him by the shoulders and starts shaking him.)

John! Listen to me! This is just Kevin's way of justifying 2 what he's doing. Don't let him suck you into this. JOHN: (Dazedly) But the students ... 3 ADAM: The students are fine, John. Trust me. (He pulls him out 5 of his chair.) Come on, let's get you to the bathroom so you can wipe that off your arm before Mr. Reynolds comes in 6 7 and sees it. JOHN: (Still in a daze, looks down at his arm, as if thinking "how did that get there?") ... my arm ... ? 9 10 ADAM: (Leading JOHN off) It's going to be alright ... 11 KEVIN: (Calls after them.) Free the students! Free the students! 12 Band together!

Shoplifter

(4 Girls)

CHARACTERS:

Tracy: Shoplifts a bottle of nail polish.

Alexis: Rough girl. Encourages Tracy; tells her shoplifting is no big deal.

Kelly: Really upset that Tracy shoplifted. Tries to get her to return the polish.

Gina: Tries to buy the polish for Tracy, but Tracy won't let her.

SETTING:

Gina, Kelly, Tracy, and Alexis are walking in together from Stage Right. They stop Center Stage when Tracy takes a bottle of nail polish out of her purse.
