MR. W: grouchy, burned-out, short-tempered, frustrated old man NICK: defensive, but basically a good kid

- 1 (Scene begins with MR. W slowly chasing after NICK, who is
- 2 crossing the stage.)
- 3 MR. W: Hey you, kid. Come here a minute.
- 4 NICK: (Wary) Yeah?
- 5 MR. W: Yeah? Don't you have no manners?
- 6 NICK: (Not interested in being friendly) Do you need
- 7 something?
- 8 MR. W: I just want to know what the heck you think you are
- 9 doing trespassing on my lawn.
- 10 NICK: I didn't trespass on your lawn.
- 11 MR. W: (Waving hands, pointing finger) Don't tell me you
- 12 didn't. I saw you. Yesterday afternoon you and your
- friends were playing ball and went and hit it over my
- fence. Climbed right over the fence and into my yard you
- come. Don't say you didn't do it.
- 16 NICK: (Remembering, then getting caught up in the story) I'm
- sorry, I didn't mean to trespass. We never hit it that far
- 18 before. That Jimmy Washington has a real good bat and
- he just ripped one. I won't go on your lawn anymore.
- 20 MR. W: Back in my days we knew how to respect people's
- 21 property. Never walk on a neighbor's yard without first
- 22 asking.
- 23 NICK: You're right. I should have knocked on your door and
- 24 asked first.
- 25 MR. W: (Backing down a little) Well, don't go knocking on my
- door during The Price is Right. I'd get really mad about

- that. No, it's all right, just don't trip on that trash back
- there and break a leg and go and sue me. Can't afford
- 3 no lawsuit, that's for sure.
- 4 NICK: Yeah, uh, I noticed that trash. (Hesitant to suggest)
- Would you like, I mean, I'd be happy to help clear some
- 6 of that trash out for you. Looks like you had some
- 7 remodeling done. I could put it out front on trash day if
- 8 you'd like.
- 9 MR. W: Doggone workers, charge me an arm and a leg to fix
- 10 the floor in my kitchen and then leave a huge truckload
- of trash in the backyard. Don't haul it away, don't
- 12 apologize. Nobody apologizes. Nobody cares an old man
- has arthritis and a bum knee and can't carry that trash
- 14 around.
- 15 NICK: Really, I'd be happy to clear it out for you.
- 16 MR. W: (Dismissively, defensively) I can't afford no helper.
- 17 NICK: I wouldn't charge you. I don't mind. It won't take me
- more than a couple of minutes. In fact, I'll bet my friends
- 19 will be glad to help me and we can get it all cleared out
- 20 in no time at all.
- 21 MR. W: (Becoming suspicious) Why would you do that?
- 22 NICK: (Shrugging, innocent) I don't know. I don't mind doing
- 23 it. It will only take a couple of minutes.
- 24 MR. W: (Apparently not accustomed to kindness from kids) I
- 25 don't know what to say.
- 26 NICK: It's all right. You don't have to say anything. We'll
- 27 come over on Wednesday night after dinner and put it
- out for the trash. No problem.
- 29 MR. W: (Now friendly and eager to chat) Well, that's really nice
- 30 of you young man. I think I have cookies sitting around
- 31 that I can get out. I might even put my lawn chair out
- 32 front and watch your game. Planning on playing baseball
- 33 on Wednesday night?
- 34 NICK: I don't know. Maybe. If it's not raining.
- 35 MR. W: All right then. I might even have some pointers for

- you. I was quite the ball player in my day. Never
- trespassed on an old man's lawn, but I got a hold of a
- 3 long one or two in my day.
- 4 NICK: Cool. See ya then. (Exits.)
