These next few scenes are a bit shorter, and will be a little easier for younger students to memorize. There's another twist written into these scenes, as well. Actors have an opportunity to add a couple of additional lines of dialogue to the endings. This is a nice challenge that adds an extra element of difficulty to these shorter scenes. Adding your own lines to the end of a scene is an effective test of our creativity, and helps actors (of all ages) develop improvisational skills. Have fun with these scenes and be as creative as possible. You can do it.

## Cafeteria

- A Did you eat lunch in the cafeteria?
- B Yes. It was just awful today!
- A It sure was! It was horrible!
- B Yeah! Disgusting!
- A Oh, and it smelled bad too . . . I don't think it was fresh hamburger . . .
- B Hamburger? I thought it was chicken!
- A Chicken? No way! It was too smelly!
- B It must have been old lamb chops!
- A No! Maybe it was stinky fish sticks!
- B Yuck! I don't feel so good ...
