 17 blah blah. But did he ask me to Prom? That would be
 18 the big N-O.
- 19 ANNE: I hate the guys at this school.
- 20 KERI: What is their problem?
- 21 ANNE: I've had a date for every Prom! Senior year ...
- 22 nothing!
- 23 JONI: I hate them!
- 24 KERI: Losers.

- 1 JONI: I don't get it.
- 2 ANNE: I hear that Brian is waiting until seven days before
- 3 Prom to actually ask someone.
- 4 KERI: All that's going to be left are the ugly girls. (She
- 5 pauses reflectively while KERI and ANNE look at her
- 6 aghast.) That would include us, wouldn't it?
- 7 ANNE: We are so not ugly.

- 7 KERI: We should go anyway.
- ANNE: Yeah. Sure.
- KERI: I'm serious. The three of us should just go and have
- 10 a good time.

- 11 ANNE: I want to go, but I'm not desperate. (JONI looks at
- her.) Well, not desperate enough to go with a sophomore or with girls.
